

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- Reading for enjoyment!
   Read a wide range of genre;
   fiction, non-fiction, poetry,
   recipes etc. Reading to and with your child.
- After Halloween: 1 book per week and then progresses to 2 books each week.
- Development of Reading Skills: recall the story, sequence the story, answering questions/ comprehension, locate information in the text, make predictions, give and justify opinions, discuss characters.












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
### Getting ready

for writing

Pre-writing skills are the fundamental skills children need to develop before they are able to write. These skills contribute to the child's ability to hold and use a pencil, and the ability to draw, write, copy, and colour.
