Internet Safety

Safer Internet Day 2019 will be celebrated globally on Tuesday 5th February with the slogan 'Together for a Better Internet'. Mrs Jenny Burke from C2k will give a presentation on Internet Safety at 9.15am in the Assembly Hall to which all parents are invited. The presentation highlights the dangers that your child may face when using the internet and social media websites. She will provide strategies to help keep your child safe while using the internet, social media and all associated apps.
